# THE YAMSESSION PRODUCERS FORUM

The YAMsession Producers Forum brings together a local production with two international producers from two different countries. The production starts by performing their existing work live for the YAMsession audience. After that, they are whisked away by the producers and over the course of the next 2 days, they work to make a 'new' production, to be presented again on the final day of the event. The whole process is followed by the audience who is encouraged to give input and reflect on what transforms a good production into a great one.

**TRIO VARIO** has been selected to star as this year's Producers Forum production. They are a classical chamber music trio from Norway made up of Julia Gusek (voice), Astrid Giæver Marvik (clarinet) and Monica Munkvold Døsen (piano). Their production is called "A Winter Adventure" and is a musical adaptation of the stories "The Little Match Girl" and "Christmas Gospel". Both music and stories complement each other in this musical fairy tale directed towards children of all ages.

The two International producers that will work with Trio Vario are Reijo Karvonen (Finland) and Caecilia Thunissen (Netherlands).

**REIJO KARVONEN** is a music teacher, musician and singer/ songwriter who has been a performing artist since 1973. In 2010 he became the Artistic Coordinator at Konserttikeskus, coaching new programs and artists for young audiences.

**CAECILIA THUNNISSEN** is an award wining opera director and dance dramaturge. Since 2015, she has been the Artistic Director of Oorkaan, creating high quality staged concerts for young audiences.
